Also in this issue is an article on the Councilmatic redistricting map. All the credit for this success goes to the community for stepping up and speaking up.


We can make a difference if we work together and take just a little time to write or call our elected leaders.



From his home base at 1605 Front Street, Kirk installs eye-catching works that bring color and conversation to daily life.

A lifelong artist, Kirk shifted from murals to abstract sculpture, now showing pieces in 37 states and Canada. His newest creations aren't just seen nationwide; they're right here at home—blending art with community for everyone to enjoy. Kirk believes public art removes barriers and enriches our neighborhoods, and his Front Street installations keep that vision alive for the whole community.


Seminary Park Children's Playground Replaced


The LCA with the assistance of Councilman Kach was able to secure \$300,000 to replace the equipment and make the park more accessible. The neighbors tell us that this is the third

playground. The first with a big aluminum slide, a wooden train, swings and a large sandbox. It lasted a long time only being replaced by the familiar domed installation in September of 1998

How do we know? Some of that equipment had a serial number on it and the manufacturer was able to track down the original plans.
