Traffic Updates

After two more serious accidents, including one where a car went into the side of a home in the 500 block West Seminary Ave, we have requested:

1) From the State new speed signs for both directions in the area from the Light Rail to I-83 2) Additional speed enforcement and 3) Parking enforcement in that same block not just for large trucks but daytime parking violations.

The new speed signs which the State approved, as of this writing, have not been installed but should be shortly.

Also a reminder that ongoing utility work has Division and Bellona Aves closed during daytime hours as work continues to move gas lines, replace water lines, and install new storm water management.

Jones Fall Trail to Northern Central Railroad Trail

On March 22, Baltimore County held the first public input meeting for the Northern Central Railroad (NCR) Trail to Jones Falls Trail (JFT) connection to review the initial routes that the county is considering. This trail would link Baltimore to York, PA with a direct, off-street connection and provide recreational & transportation opportunities to the entire York Road Corridor.

JFT to NCR Trail descriptions:

The descriptions below were created by the LCA to describe the proposed trail options through our community. They correspond to the maps in this article and not those previously distributed by the County.

Option 1


The Purple line that goes to the far left of the image avoids the entire LCA community, it goes across Timonium Road onto Thornton where there aren't front facing homes, and the road/sidewalks are wide and already in place. According to persons at the meeting this is the route they currently use.


Option 2

The Yellow line (which shows two options, or a loop in Peach) connects above LCA on Timonium Road at Greenspring Drive. It connects the parts of Greenspring Drive moving into CCP. It connects the dead ends of Greenspring, Riderwood, and Notre Dame. Then across Talbot coming out behind then through the Seminary Roundtop Apartment complex, then right at an odd angle onto Seminary Ave. at the bridge over I-83.

Option 3

The Dark Pink on the middle comes down Aylesbury, west across Business Park Drive, down a non-existent part of Greenspring, back across the tracks somewhere that also doesn't exist, essentially below the Merritt commercial buildings onto the Lutherville Station property, connecting to the access road (which is part of the East Coast Greenway route).

JFT to NCR Trail (cont.)

Option 4

Continuing from Option 3 - Then this route which continues in Dark Burgundy either follows the Light Rail State Property to Front down to Lincoln Ave through the somewhere through Cardiff or through Creighton Center under the Beltway.

Option 5

Continuing from Option 3 - Or in Dark Green old Lutherville along Kurtz onto Melancthon onto Front rejoining the route described right above at Front/ Melancthon (part of the East Coast Greenway Route).

Option 6

In Light Orange starting at Aylesbury follows the access road of Lutherville Station into old Lutherville along Francke (part of the East Coast Greenway Route) across Seminary down Clark joining Charles Street (part of the East Coast Greenway Route).

Note A

There is a Lime Green connector or other option across Lincoln Ave between the Front Ave and Francke Ave/Clark Ave routes above.





Note B

There are lots of reasons not to do many of these options: narrow community streets, no shoulders, no walkways/sidewalks, connecting areas that we have promises from the County not to connect, crossing the Light Rail tracks, and crossing private property. I think there are even some homes on Emerson they don't know are there. Also many of the paths are in the flood zone.

These routes include building a bikeable bridge over Roland Run, creating bike trails in the flood zone, creating more crossings over the light rail tracks. The NCR Trail is 10 feet wide. Parts of the JFT are also quite wide where they have built ADA compliant boardwalks. We've added some images of NCR trail and the JFT to give perspective of the size/width of the trails currently in place.

Royal Farms Development Update by DVIA

The DVIA (Dulaney Valley Improvement Association) is actively using the legal system to review, change or stop the development. Our attorney, Carrol Holzer, retired in January and we have retained Micheal McCann.

The DVIA has requested a petition for a zoning hearing. It would require the developer to obtain zoning approval for (12) Tesla Level 3 Superchargers. Pete Zimmerman, People's Counsel, has joined us in the petition. We expect a hearing in late April or May.

The DVIA has appealed to the circuit court the Board of Appeals decision that supported the Development Review Committee decision for a "Limited Exemption" from a community input meeting. Our brief is due May 12th. We feel we have a justifiable argument and intend to carry it through the justice system.

The SHA has sadly approved the access and egress locations for the development. We are unhappy with their decision, which we believe has been poorly reviewed. We are closely following the development approval process. The zoning and planning reviews have not been completed. When the development plan is approved we have 30 days to appeal.

Meetings with Councilman Kach re: Lutherville Station

As previously reported, representatives from the LCA are attending meetings at the request of the Councilman, along with other stakeholders in Lutherville Station. The meetings so far have not involved any discussions about what might be built there as a part of the redevelopment.

All stakeholders were asked to provide feedback on any aspect of the potential redevelopment, without identifying what would actually be built there, whether it be commercial, residential, or something mixed use. The LCA provided a lengthy list based on community feedback.

There a lot of people involved in these meeting and the tension is palpable. That said, we are trying to keep an open mind and listen to all perspectives.

Most of all, we are listening to you -- our neighbors and constituents. We have surveyed the community (<u>results are posted on the LCA website</u>) and have listened to your thoughts and comments.

The LCA board will be arranging some listening and input opportunities with our community. We will gather in small groups so we can have discussions with our LCA members. 




